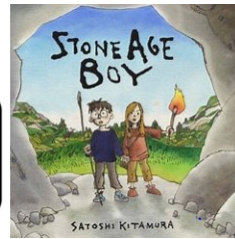

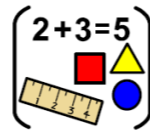
English

In English, we will be reading Stone Age Boy, a text which links with our History topic. We will be revising how to use commas in a list and will be introducing prepositions and adverbials of time and place. Our final outcome will be to re-write the ending of the story.

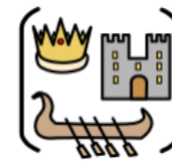

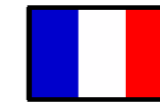
