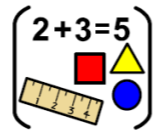
English

In English we will use the video Marshmallow as a writing hook. We will be focusing on sentence structure and will be embedding our previous learning. We will also be spending time on our handwriting and focusing on developing joined up letters.

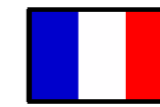
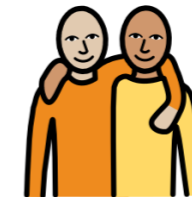

RE

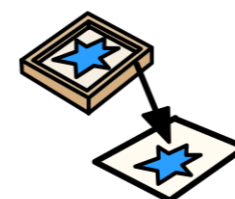
In RE, we will be exploring the concept of 'Belonging' through the Buddhist religion. We will be looking at the Buddhist festival Wesak.
